Slips	All visitors  Cuts, grazes, musculo-skeletal injury, fractures		* Request that visitors wear suitable footwear  * Supervision of child visitors - to reduce running, request stick to paths, extra supervision if off-pathways  * Safety induction highlighting slippery areas, eg gravel path to river, long grass  * First aid facilities in Reception/ Trained First Aiders on staff		* Adult visitors  * Green School staff
Trips	All visitors  Cuts, grazes, musculo-skeletal injury, fractures		* Plan route in advance to avoid trip hazards and to move any objects lying across proposed route (eg hoses, sticks, electrical cables in wakas)  * First aid facilities in Reception/ Trained First Aiders on staff		* Green School staff
Falls	All visitors  Cuts, grazes, musculo-skeletal injury, concussion, fractures		* Close supervision of visitors in playground and river areas and elevated areas such as verandahs, viewing platforms, etc  * Assess risks on the day if taking the group near the river, based on: mobility, recent rainfall, capacity to manage their own risks based on observations earlier in the tour  * First aid facilities in Reception/ Trained First Aiders on staff		* Adult visitors  * Green School staff

Hit by object	All visitors  Bruising, cuts, grazes, musculo-skeletal injury, concussion, fractures, eye injury		* When planning camp be aware of any activities that could involve moving objects (eg ball games, mowing) and avoid getting too close to those activities  *Supervision of learners to reduce risk of thrown objects while visitors are nearby			* Green School staff  * Adult visitors
Sharp objects	All visitors		* Safety induction: ask adult visitors to position themselves between learners and likely sources of sharp or hot objects: eg in kitchens  * Planning: avoid areas with known sharp objects - eg thorny plants or "cutty grass"  * Vigilance - be aware of metal near outdoor furniture, building areas, etc. Report anything sharp you see.			* Green School staff
Dust and pollen	All visitors  * eye injury * breathing difficulty * allergic reaction		* Safety induction: ask about known allergies  * eye baths and saline solution in first aid kits			Green School staff
